3.0 CONFLICT OF INTEREST

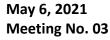
No conflicts were declared.

7.1 2021 Q1 Financial Statements

Highlighting:

- Operating surplus of \$1.7 million in the first quarter. Planned budget items are on target for infrastructure renewal.
 - Total revenue of \$5.7 million for the quarter.
 - o Reduced watermain and hydrant maintenance as well as some staff vacancies.
 - Admin expense lower due to reduced allocations from PUC Services.
- Capital low for the first quarter overall relative to the budget. Typical for the Commission as we ramp up to Spring/Summer.
 - o Zone 2 Booster will be completed in 2021

 - News article on PUC assisting with transportation for vaccine appointments.
 - In the Community
 - Transportation assistance for Covid Vaccine appointments being provided by PUC Customer Care staff. Positive for the community.
 - PUC Free Tree Giveaway 2,500 seedlings are being offered to the community to plant as well as education on how to safely plant around powerlines. Represents community renewal.



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- Covid-19 Response
 - PUC has provided maximum flexibility to staff during the stay-at-home order as well as schools being closed with kids continuing their education remotely.
- Standard of Care Documents
 - o Documents were posted in the Resource Center in Diligent Boards. Once we can meet in person, another training session will be held.
- Finance Dashboard
 - o Cashflow projection reviewed.
 - Aged Accounts receivables reviewed. It has been stabilizing.
